- Budget was updated – Increased revenue by \$30,000 (State Grants) and \$30,000(CSP).
- Telehealth program has started and will be available through Human Services. Lisa will be working with this program.

- Public Health will once again pay towards the Youth Leadership Conference at the Lion's Camp in Rosholt. We will cover \$2000 toward total.

## Directors Report -

- There continues to be bed bug and flea infestations as well as head lice in the community. These pests are a nuisance and not a health hazard. We have been seeing hand, foot, and mouth disease and impetigo in children.
- Discussion on flea problem. Gloria will check with other counties to see if they have an ordinance limiting the number of animals in a home. Gloria will invite Crisse Reynolds, Animal Control Officer to next meeting to speak. She may be able to help with an ordinance.
- An inmate was sent to hospital for three days with DTs
- We have been busy with flu vaccinations in community and schools.
- Hygienist will not be writing a grant for school based sealants due to the extensive paperwork/documentation involved, but she will continue to do school based sealants.

- Clear & Simple is an educational series Public Health will present in Gays Mills on November 7<sup>th</sup> and November 15. Topics covered will include understanding cancer basics, cancer prevention, cancer self-care, screening, and detection. Crawford County is ranked among high cancer rate in southwest Wisconsin.
- Radon tests will be offered again this winter season. High radon level is linked to lung cancer.
