The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) announces that children 5-11 years old are now eligible to receive the Pfizer-BioNTech (Pfizer) COVID-19 vaccine. The Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine requires two doses 21 days apart for full protection, and is the first and only vaccine currently available for this age group.

Covid-19 Vaccine Booster doses are authorized for everyone who got one Johnson and Johnson dose at least 2 months ago and people who got both doses of Moderna or Pfizer at least 6 months ago and are at higher risk for getting or spreading Covid-19. Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine product they receive as a booster dose. Some people may prefer the vaccine product that they received for their primary series, and others may prefer to get a different product for their booster. If you are unsure as to which booster you want call our office at 608-326-0229

Additional doses are also available for people who are moderately to severely immunocompromised. Eligible people can get an additional mRNA dose 28 days after completing their initial two-dose mRNA COVID-19 vaccine series.
