Re-opening of Campgrounds

Governor Evers's Emergency Order #28 Safer at Home Order, which extends the current Safer at Home Order from April 24, 2020 to May 26, 2020, includes a few changes to allow more businesses and activities to open back up in a safe manner. This order also supersedes any local order that is in conflict with his order. Thus, campgrounds will be allowed to open with some restrictions, which include the social distancing requirements and the continued non-essential travel advisory.

Social Distancing Requirements include:

- a. Maintaining social distancing of six (6) feet between people;
- b. Washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds as frequently as possible or using hand sanitizer;
- c. Covering coughs or sneezes (into the sleeve or elbow, not hands);
- d. Regularly cleaning high-touch surfaces;
- e. Not shaking hands; and
- f. Following all other public health recommendations issued by DHS and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control.

Governor Evers's order and Crawford County's continued travel advisory both strongly encourage individuals to remain at their primary residence or home, stating:

- a. Travel to second homes or residences should be avoided if possible.
- b. Consistent with federal guidance and to protect our neighboring states, Wisconsinites are encouraged to stay close to home and strongly discouraged from engaging in unnecessary travel.
- c. Due to high community transmission in certain areas of the State and across state borders, Crawford County is recommending that you stay in your primary home area. Due to our limited healthcare infrastructure, please do not visit us now.
- d. People who have seasonal homes and property in Crawford County, please stay at your winter homes at this time if possible. If you do come to Crawford County, you must immediately self-isolate for 14 days.
