

**Public Safety Minutes  
October 13, 2020**

The meeting was called to order using ZOOM at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Gari Lorenz. Members attending by ZOOM is Brad Steiner, Don Stirling, Carl Orr, 911 Coordinator Julie Cipra, Cindy Riniker, RN. Members attending in person are Sheriff Dale McCullick, Emergency Management Jim Hackett, Coroner Joe Morovits, Greg Russell, and Administrative Assistant Joyce Fritsche-Roberts. Lt. Russ Wittrig entered the meeting at 9:53 am.

The meeting was verified as having been properly posted. Next meeting is November 10, 2020 at 8:30 am for signing of bills and 9:00 am for start of meeting.

Motion by Russell, second by Stirling to approve the minutes of the September meeting. The motion carried with no negative votes cast.

**Coroner:** Coroner's bills were presented. Motion by Russell, second by Lorenz to approve the Coroner's bills. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.

**911 Coordinator:** 911 bills were presented.

The new Vesta NG911 system is on schedule as planned and equipment will be delivered October 20<sup>th</sup>. There will be several weeks of system set up and training and go-live the first week of December.

The NG911 mapping pilot project gap analysis came back and the report was very good although there will still be a fair amount of work to complete in order to be ready for the new standards.

Motion by Russell, second by Steiner to approve the 911 bills. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.

**Emergency Management:** Jim presented bills.

A COVID testing site was done in the North Crawford area with the assistance of the National Guard.

Some townships and villages have turned over their Roads to Recovery money they received and have not used. The money can be used to offset expenses incurred because of COVID.

Motion by Russell, second by Lorenz to approve the Emergency Management bills. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.

**Public Health:** Crawford County has moved back to Phase 1. Flu shots continue to be given.

**Sheriff:** Two employees were sent home due to possible COVID exposure.

The jail had an attempted suicide.

Lt. Wittrig entered the meeting at 9:53 am. He explained the yearly jail inspection.

Motion by Russell, second by Lorenz to approve the Sheriff's' bills and bank statements. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.
