February 10, 2015

- Call to order** The meeting was called to order at 9:32 a.m. by Chairman Kersten Rocksvold. Committee members Greg Russell and Mary Jane Faas were present. Also present were Sheriff Dale McCullick, Coroner Joe Morovits, 911 Coordinator Julie Cipra, Public Health Director Gloria Wall, RN and Administrative Assistant Joyce Fritsche-Roberts. Committee members Marge Sheckler, Phil Mueller and Emergency Government Roger Martin were absent.
- Verify posting** The meeting was verified as having been properly posted.
- Next meeting** March 10, 2015.
- Approval of Minutes** Russell moved; Faas seconded to approve the minutes of the January 13, 2015 meeting. The motion carried with no negative votes cast.
- Public Health** Public Health Preparedness is realigning districts. As a result, Crawford County will become part of a new district in the consortium.
- Coroner** Respirator units have been given to the deputies. Russell moved; Faas seconded to approve the Coroner's bills. The motion carried with no negative votes cast.
- 911 Coordinator** Hare Electric fixed the electrical issue at the Seneca Tower. Lisa Beesecker and Julie Cipra will attend a Field Training Officer class at Southwest Tech. Faas moved; Russell seconded to approve 911 bills. The motion carried with no negative votes cast.
- Emergency Government** The Sheriff submitted bills for Emergency Government. Faas moved; Russell seconded to approve the bills. The motion carried with no negative votes cast.
- Sheriff** Crawford and Grant County Sheriff offices have consolidated their Dive Teams to save money. They will train together and more personnel will be available for calls. Clayton County, Iowa and Crawford County will work together on the river patrol. Clayton County has a boat. Dale is applying for a DNR grant to help pay for the patrol. The goal is to promote safety on the water.
- Dale McCullick and Julie Cipra will attend the February 17th County Board meeting to discuss using money in their 2014 budgets to pay for simulcasting, \$90,000, and tower site alarms, \$20,500. Narrow band communication is becoming a thing of the past.
- Russell moved; Faas second to approve the Sheriff's bills and bank statements. The motion carried with no negative votes cast.
- Adjournment** Russell moved; Faas seconded to adjourn. The motion carried with no negative votes cast and the meeting adjourned at 10:15 a.m.
