

Public Safety Minutes
January 11, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Gari Lorenz. Greg Russell, Don Stirling and Brad Steiner were present. Members attending by ZOOM was Carl Orr and Sonya Lenzendorf. Members attending in person was Coroner Joe Morovits, Sheriff Dale McCullick, 911 Coordinator Julie Cipra, Emergency Management Jim Hackett and Administrative Assistant Joyce Fritsche-Roberts.

The meeting was verified as having been posted. Next meeting is February 8, 2022 at 9:00 am for signing of bills and 9:30 am for start of meeting

Motion by Steiner second by Russell to approve the minutes of the December meeting. The motion carried with no negative votes cast.

Coroner: Joe is helping Emergency Management with testing clinics. Motion by Russell, second by Steiner to approve the bills. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.

911 Coordinator: A GIS grant is available through the Property Lister's office and Julie will be submitting for a new mapping laptop, software licensing and some outsourcing expenses.

Another grant may come available through the State for NG911 expenses which she will apply for. The next couple of years will be very busy with NG911 mapping changes, updates and education.

Motion by Steiner second by Lorenz to approve the bills. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.

Emergency Management: National Guard continues to test in this month. The management switch at the state caused one date to be missed in Crawford County. Meals for the National Guard and Joe's time for working is FEMA reimbursable.

ARPA Grant was used to cover employee salaries.

The Sheriff's Office received a \$30,000 body cam grant.

Motion by Steiner, second by Lorenz to approve the bills. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.

Public Health:

Crawford County is averaging 22 COVID cases per day. Currently there is an outbreak in the prison. There is a shortage of COVID Rapid Test. The standard for quarantine is 5 days.

Sheriff: Dale is meeting with a company named TOTAL UPFITTERS LLC to discuss having this company install and switchover the equipment when new squads are purchased.

Dale has had contact with Aladtec, an online scheduling and payroll system program. A demonstration is being planned.

Dale and the sheriff employee's union rep will meet with the Personnel Committee in regard to the Combating Violent Crimes in Rural Areas grant received.

A grant was received through the Badger State Sheriff's Association for \$24,792 to purchase new tasers.

Motion by Russell second by Lorenz to approve the Sheriff's' bills and bank statements. The motions carried with no negative votes cast.

Adjournment: Motion by Russell, second by Steiner to adjourn. The motion carried with no negative votes cast and the meeting adjourned at 10:04 am.
