2021 Crawford County Tree Sale

Red Oak (*Quercus Rubra*)

Hardy northern oak prized for its lumber and beneficial acorns. Dark waxy green leaves.
Medium to fast growth..... 80-100 feet

Chinkapin Oak (*Quercus muehlenbergii*)

Small, sweet acorns up are up to 1" in size, ripening in September and October. This is the preferred acorn of white tailed deer, squirrels, chipmunks, turkey and other birds and mammals. Chinkapin Oak are found on limestone outcrops and are tolerant of alkaline soils. Moderate growth.....40-70' Height

Bitternut Hickory (*Carya cordiformis*)

A versatile eastern hardwood with benefit to man and beast, grows well in poorly drained swamps to sterile uplands. Predictable heavy nut crops feed deer, squirrels and turkey throughout their range. Seed origin, collected in Wisconsin's Mississippi backwaters. Medium growth.....50-75 feet

Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*)

Excellent ornamental, deep green leaves. Great food for wildlife, highly prized wood. Fruit used for preserves.
Medium growth.....60-70 feet

River Birch (*Betula nigra*) (single stem/tree)

Excellent ornamental tree, very heat and cold tolerant. Resistant to insects that plague the white birch. Quickly replacing white birch as a valuable landscape tree. Exfoliating cinnamon to light creamy white bark. Fast growth....90 feet

White Birch (*Betula papyrifera*)

Ornamental - beautiful and unique white bark that peels in papery layers, golden fall color. Great wildlife value. Favorite as an ornamental specimen or planted in clumps of 3, 5 or 7. This version of the White Birch has a high resistance to birch borers. Fast growth.....50-70 feet

Sugar Maple (*Acer Saccharum*)

Hardy maple valued for many woodland projects. Makes a great shade tree and is valued for its syrup and lumber. Brilliant fall color. Fast growth.....70 feet

White Cedar (*Thuja occidentalis*) (*Arborvitae*)

Native to the eastern U.S. and Canada. Excellent for screens, windbreaks and wildlife habitat. Does well in poorly drained sites. Wood from Cedar does not rot making it preferred for outdoor projects. Fast growth.....25-35 feet

Balsam Fir (*Abies balsamea*)

Soft, bright green needles, very popular Christmas tree. Needs very little shearing. Medium growth.....75 feet

White Spruce (*Picea Glauca*)

Hardy northern spruce with stiff bluish green needles. Short needle length. Great bird habitat and thermal cover for wildlife, thick symmetric growth. Fast growth75 feet

American Hazelnut (*Corylus americana*)

A vigorous multi stemmed shrub, tolerant of varied soil types, dark green summer foliage turning bright yellow or burgundy in fall. Interesting floret type, seed pockets hold sweet filberts highly prized by man and beast. Fast growth.....10 feet

American Plum (*Prunus americana*)

Small tree, with profuse white sweet smelling flowers followed by sweet red plums and brilliant fall color. Very hardy, benefits man and wildlife. Medium growth....20 feet

Ninebark (*Physocarpus Opulifolius*)

Masses of white flowers, atop a tough adaptable shrub that produces small seeds and cover important to our native songbirds and great for deer cover. Fast growth.....5-7 feet
